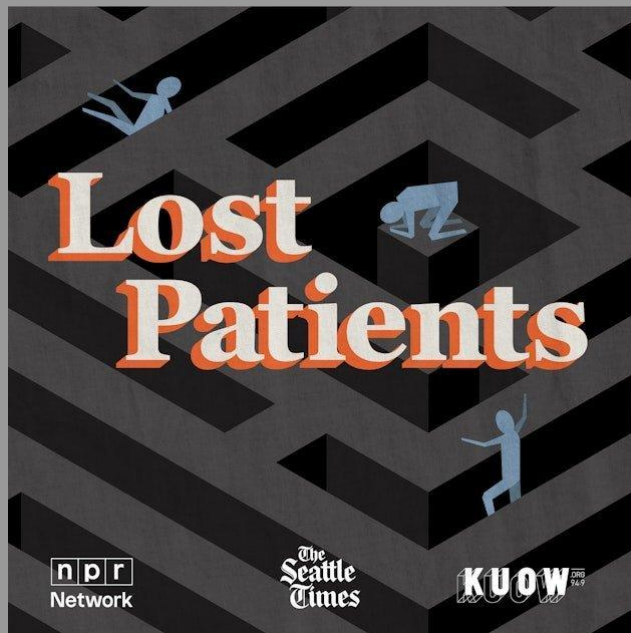

Competency screening results are not criminal forensic mental health evaluations

In October 2015, a public defender flagged Adam's case for a mental health screening. A mental health counselor in Snohomish County found Adam appeared to "currently suffer from symptoms of a mental disorder." But the counselor also found he could understand the legal proceedings well enough to assist in his own defense — so he wasn't flagged for treatment. Instead, Adam was jailed for a month and fined \$600.

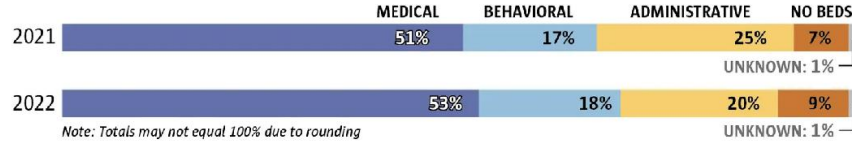

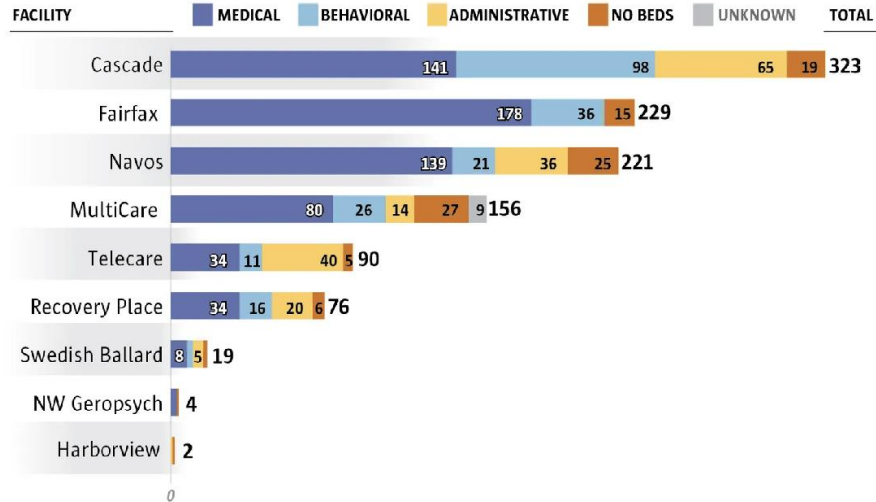
Why people in King County are turned away from care

Every year hundreds of people are denied care at an evaluation and treatment facility or inpatient psychiatric unit that can help stabilize people who are having a mental health crisis. Overall, the denial rate for King County facilities in 2022 was similar to past years at 25%, though some people may be referred or declined more than once.
